

## **Phoenix Workforce Connection Board Project Based Taskforces**

### **PWC On-Boarding**

Improving the orientation process and mentoring of new board members of the Phoenix Workforce Connection Board. Define what to expect during the first 30 days, the first 3 months, and the first year of board membership.

### **Bank of America sponsored Professional Career Center Project**

Meet with members of the PWC and Maricopa Workforce Connections Board, and the Governor's Council on Workforce Policy Board to investigate the feasibility of creating a professional career center in Phoenix similar to the Career Center in Charlotte, NC.

### **Improving PWC's On-Line Community Calendar**

Developing/Improving a PWC On-line calendar of events to become the central point for accessing current information pertaining to job fairs, job postings, access points, and employment resources. This includes adding links to other pertinent resources for job seekers.

### **Providing Remote Access to PWC services**

Develop alternative ways for customers to access PWC services, to include training and services, that don't have to take place in a face-to-face setting. Research partnering with other agencies to assist in providing video services (Rio Salado College, Jobing.com, Phoenix Channel 11) that can be linked to the PWC website or broadcast on a cable television channel.

### **PWC Business and Training Center Development**

Assist PWC staff in the development, design, and completion of a new Business and Training Center. The City of Phoenix owns property located at 2120 North Central Ave., which is being considered for a potential Business and Training Center.

### **Maricopa Human Capitol Collaboration (MHCC) Participation**

Assist in the development of potential non-financial memorandum of understandings as agreement among MHCC partners, and support the community efforts. This will be accomplished through a one-time meeting.
